


Certified Livestock Manager Training

Purpose

Manure from large livestock and poultry farms can be an asset as an organic fertilizer when handled and recycled properly. It can also be the largest liability for a farm if handled incorrectly. The Ohio Department of Agriculture is sponsoring a Certified Livestock Training Session for any farmer or custom applicator who needs to get licensed by ODA, or who wants to learn more about best manure management practices. As nutrient management, whether commercial fertilizer or manure, becomes more of a debated issue, education is a key component to making the right decisions in the field.

This two-day session will provide discussions on nutrient management, insect and rodent control, record keeping, road issues, manure contracts, neighbor relations and a review of the rules and regulations concerning manure handling. The first day of the session will focus on general topics related to ODA rules and other important components of nutrient management. The second day will be filled with outside presenters that will provide their diverse background in the agenda items listed. The training enables participants to complete all the training needed for certification. Certified Livestock Managers will need 10 hours of continuing education every three years to maintain their certification.

Who is required to attend?

- ◆ Anyone who buys, sells or land applies more than 4,500 dry tons of solid manure or 25 million gallons of liquid manure a year.
- ◆ Anyone who manages and/or handles manure at a major concentrated animal facility.

Who should attend?

- ◆ Anyone who buys, sells or land applies less manure who wants to learn more about best management practices.
- ◆ Anyone wanting CLM continuing education credit.
- ◆ Anyone wanting CCA continuing education credit.

Certification Requirements

To receive Certified Livestock Manager licensing through the Ohio Department of Agriculture, a farmer or custom applicator must attend both days of training, complete the Certified Livestock Manager application and submit the \$50 application fee payable to: Ohio Department of Agriculture.
