How can the public be involved?

Public participation and education are important parts of the Ohio Department of Agriculture (ODA) permitting process for large livestock and poultry farms. The Livestock Environmental Permitting Program (LEPP) Web site (<http://www.agri.ohio.gov/divs/LEPP/Lepp.aspx>) is a key vehicle for information, along with local information repositories and public information meetings.

Draft permits: Farmers planning to construct a permitted livestock or poultry facility must submit an application for a draft Permit to Install (PTI) and a draft Permit to Operate (PTO) with the Livestock Environmental Permitting Program. Once these applications are complete, the LEPP engineering staff reviews the documents and works with the farm applicant(s) on making any necessary changes. This also includes several on-site inspections. In addition, an environmental background check of the owner(s)/operator(s) is conducted by the LEPP legal staff. If the application meets all of the state requirements, the draft PTI/PTO will be issued.

A public notice of the draft permits is issued to a newspaper of general circulation in the area where the facility is located and a press release is issued to the county media. In addition, a notice and a copy of the draft permits will be mailed to the following:

- Board of county commissioners for that county
- Board of township trustees for that county
- Local board of health
- Local soil and water conservation district
- Owners or operators of public water systems that have surface water intake structures located within 10 miles downstream of the proposed farm

The public notice and press release of the draft permits are also posted on the LEPP Web site. Any person interested in facilities in their area or county can request that ODA put them on an interested party mailing list.

Final permits: Once the permits are final, a public notice will again be sent to a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the facility is located and a press release sent to the local media. The public notice and news release on the final permits will also be posted on the LEPP Web site. If a public hearing is conducted, a copy of the final notice and a responsiveness summary will be sent to all those who testified on-the-record, and to those who expressed their comments to the department in writing during the 30-day public comment period.
