In accordance with OAC rule 901:10-6-01, public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Department of Agriculture (ODA) has issued a final Permit to Operate (PTO) for Porky's Swine Farm located in Auglaize County, Saint Marys Township, at 00143 Southland Road, St. Marys, Ohio 45885. The facility, which is in the St. Marys Watershed, is owned and operated by Porky's II Partnership, P.L.L., Kevin Katterhenry, Travis Temple, Brent Miller and Kent Miller.

The department issued a Review Compliance Certificate (RCC) to Porky's Swine Farm in 2004 to operate for a period of five years, after which time the farm was required to apply for a PTO. A Permit to Operate is drafted to regulate operations with plans for manure management, insect and rodent control, mortality management and emergency response. This PTO is also valid for a five-year period, at which time the owners will be required to renew the operating permit.

The existing farm has a total design capacity of 4,000 swine weighing over 55 lbs., which remains the same under the final PTO.

The Porky's Swine Farm final Permit to Operate can be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC) at 309 South Fourth Street, Room 222, in Columbus, Ohio 43215. The appeal period ends at 5:00 p.m. on Feb. 22, 2010. A copy of the appeal must be served on the Director of Agriculture within three days after filing the appeal with ERAC.
