



CERTIFIED LIVESTOCK MANAGER APPLICATION FORM

Instructions: In order to become a Certified Livestock Manager in the State of Ohio, through the Ohio Department of Agriculture, this form must be completed. A Certified Livestock Manager (CLM) certification is required for any of the following:

1. For a Major Concentrated Animal Feeding Facility (MCAFF) as defined in Ohio Revised Code Section 903.01. Examples of MCAFFs include facilities with more than 10,000 cattle; more than 7,000 mature dairy cattle; more than 10,000 veal calves; more than 25,000 swine over 55 lbs. or 100,000 swine under 55 lbs.; more than 550,000 turkeys, or more than 820,000 laying hens with other than a liquid manure handling system.
2. For a person who is a livestock manure broker who buys, sells, or land applies annually more than 4,500 dry tons of manure, or more than 25 million gallons of liquid manure.
3. For a person who is a livestock manure applicator who land applies and transports annually more than 4,500 dry tons of manure, or more than 25 million gallons of liquid manure.

Other requirements for a CLM are set forth in Section 903.07 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Rules 901:10-1-06 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC).

2. "I acknowledge that the following records must be kept by me and made available to the Ohio Department of Agriculture.
 - a. A record and a list or description of acres for each land application of manure, and notation if the land is owned or leased by the owner of the manure.
 - b. If applying liquid manure on land with subsurface drains, record periodic observations of any drain outlets during and after application.
 - c. If applying liquid manure on land with subsurface drains, record use of drain outlet plugs or other such devices during and after application.
 - d. A record of all soil tests results within the last five years.
 - e. Record site inspections to inspect setbacks used to maintain vegetative cover and to protect stream channels or areas adjacent to stream channels.
 - f. Record date, rate, quantity and method of application of the nutrient, the form and source of manure or commercial fertilizer or other organic by-products.
 - g. Record the total amount of nitrogen and phosphorus actually applied to each field and document the calculations for the total amount applied.
 - h. Record the condition of soil at the time of application including, but not limited to, available water capacity and evidence of soil cracks and related information on soil conditions.
 - i. Record temperature, including general weather conditions at the time of application and for 24 hours prior to and following application."

CERTIFIED LIVESTOCK MANAGER CONTINUING EDUCATION
