Purpose

Manure from large livestock and poultry farms can be an asset when handled and recycled properly as a fertilizer. It can also be the largest liability for a farm if handled incorrectly. The Ohio Department of Agriculture, Ohio Livestock Coalition, OSU Extension, Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Natural Resources Conservation Service, CSREES Great Lakes Regional Water Quality Program are sponsoring a Certified Livestock Manager Training Session for any farmer or custom applicator who needs to get licensed by ODA or who wants to learn more about best management practices concerning manure management.

This one-day training session combined with the Manure Science Review will provide nutrient management training, manure storage and handling training, and a review of the rules and regulations concerning manure handling. This combined training session enables participants to complete all the training needed for initial certification. Certified Livestock Managers will need 10 hours of continuing education every three years to maintain certification.

Who is required to attend?

- Anyone who manages and/or handles manure at a major concentrated animal feeding facility.
- Anyone who buys, sells, or land applies more than 4,500 dry tons or 25 million gallons of liquid manure a year.

Who should attend?

- Anyone who buys, sells, or land applies less manure who wants to learn more about best management practices.
- Anyone wanting continuing education credit.

Certification Requirements

To receive Certified Livestock Manager licensing through ODA, a farmer or custom applicator must attend three “core” training sessions and three “elective” sessions, complete the Certified Livestock Manager application, and submit a \$30 application fee payable to: Ohio Department of Agriculture.
